## **Ephesians chapter 6 questions**

Read through the entire Book of Ephesians.

- 1). Why do you think God put this commandment (verse 2) together with this promise (verse 3)? What connection do you see between them?
- 2). How should verse 4 affect a parent's attitude and behavior toward his or her children? Try to be specific.
- 3). To what extent do you think Paul's teaching for slaves applies to modern people employed for wages or serving in the home? Why?
- 4). What fact should a person in authority always keep in mind when dealing with subordinates (see verse 9)?
- 5). What is Paul's counsel in verses 10-11 and 13-14 for engaging in the struggle defined in verses 11-12?
- 6). Make a list of the different pieces of the armor of God. Explain the pieces and their purposes in fighting the devil's schemes.
- 7). How does Paul tell us to pray in order to defeat Satan according to verses 18-19?

Using the acronym <u>SPECK</u> to aid in applying what you've studied in this chapter, answer the following: What <u>Sin</u> am I being taught to avoid? What <u>Promise</u> do I need to claim? What <u>Example</u> should I follow? What <u>Command</u> do I need to keep? How has this chapter increased my <u>Knowledge</u> of God?

Consider this question as we end our study of Ephesians: have you noticed any areas (thoughts, attitudes, opinions, behavior) in which you have changed as a result of studying Paul's letter to the Ephesian church? If so, explain how you have changed.
