- Session 1 – The Role of the Worship Leader (September 26th)

You can't look at the role of the Worship Leader and not look at the theology of worship. In this session we'll explore both using Bob Kauflin's book, "Worship Matters" as a guide for our conversation. Specific topics covered will include, "What do I love?", "What do I believe?", "What do I practice?" & "What do I model?".

- Session 2 - Head & Heart (October 3rd)

Session 7 – The Posture of Worship (November 7th)

True worshipers want to make much of Christ through congregational singing. They desire that others' attention be fixed on God and the thought of people being distracted by our raising of hands or kneeling down in worship can sometimes seem odd. So why does it matter? In fact, shouldn't people just focus their attention on God and not us? In this session, we'll talk about the mandate to "display God's glory" for the world to see, both on stage and off.
